# One Hundred Years Ago Today

The world took several small steps toward World War II this month. On November 4 th, Hitler established the Brown Shirts (Sturmabteilung) as an arm of the Nazi Party. On the same date, Japanese Prime Minister Hara Takashi was assassinated by a right-wing switchyard operator in Tokyo, establishing a political precedent for assassinating the nation's leaders that would endure through WWII.

The following day, the USSR signed a treaty with the new government of Mongolia, temporarily supporting the government against Japanese and Chinese incursions. Hungary passed a law invalidating the Habsburg line of succession to the throne on November 7<sup>th</sup>, Two days later, Mussolini formed the Fascist party in Italy.

The Washington Arms Limitation Conference began on the 12th and would last into 1922. The intent was to limit the construction of battleships, the first arms race of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Unbeknownst to the Japanese, the US State Department's Black Chamber had broken the Japanese diplomatic code and was reading Japan's instructions to her representatives. The final result would be a 10:10:6.5 Britain:US:Japan battleship ratio. Japan believed she needed a minimum 10:10:7 ratio in order to destroy the U.S. fleet in the mid-Pacific. When former Black Chamber head Herbert Yardley published a book in 1930 describing how the US had manipulated Japan, Japanese militarists were enraged.

The US, France, Great Britain, and Japan signed a Pacific Treaty on November 13th.

The following day, the Spanish Communist Party was founded.

On November 11 th, President Harding dedicated the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington Cemetery, and the WWI Unknown was interred. Among the honorary pall bearers were former Sergeant Alvin York and former Lt. Col. Charles Whittlesey, commander of the 'Lost Battalion'. Unable to cope with the memories of what his battalion had endured in the 1918 Meuse-Argonne Campaign, a few weeks after the ceremony, Whittlesey booked passage on a ship to Cuba and stepped over the rail one night at sea.

On the 23 rd , President Harding signed the Willis-Campbell Act forbidding doctors from prescribing beer or liquor for medicinal purposes. Finally, radio station KYW began transmitting in Philadelphia, PA on November 15th.

Famous births this month included: actor Charles Bronson, born in Ehrenfeld, PA on November 3rd; novelist James Jones (From Here to Eternity), born in Robinson, IL on the 6<sup>th</sup>; actor Brian Keith, born in Bayonne, NJ on the 14<sup>th</sup>, comedian Dangerfield (John Cohen), born in Babylon, NY on the 22nd ; former New York City Mayor John Lindsay, born in New York City on the 24th ; and actress Dagmar (Virginia Egnor) born in Yawkey, WV on the 29th .

This month saw the announcement of an 'auto food cooker' for tourists and truck drivers. A box located beneath the driver's seat was connected inline to the vehicle's exhaust pipe. One can only speculate on flavor of the food.
